

ST. CALL'S: Newcomers to this Tournement, they come from Belfast with Ireland's tallest Senior International. Have youth Internationals as well plus experience.

ST. MARY'S: From Athlone and a leading Club in Leinster. Long established with a record of many honours and Internationals over the years.

ST. VINCENT'S: Ireland's National Cup holders and No. 1 team for the past four years. Every team member is an International with overseas experience.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE GALWAY (U.C.G.): The top team in the city and Connaght Junior League holders last season.

UNITED STATES NAVY (U.S.N.): Visiting us from the U.S. Naval Base in Derry with all their players coming from several different States. Each year they bring a different team but always display attractive Basketball.

SLIGO ALL STARS: The Tournament's "Home Team" and placed No. 2 in Ireland's Mational Cup. Have several Tournament victories and many International players.

RULES IN BRIEF.

- I. A basketball team consists of five players on court plus a maximum of seven substitutes. A team is allowed an unlimited number of substitutions during the game.
- 2. Basketball is essentially a no-contact game. A player who makes personal contact with an opponent commits a foul. If a player commits five fouls he must leave the game.
 - 3. A basket scored from play counts as two points.
- 4. A player who is fouled in the act of shooting is awarded two free-throws. A basket scored from a free-throw counts as one point.
- 5. During the last three minutes of play of the second half and during all periods of extra time all personal fouls shall be considered as committed on a player who is throwing for goal. The offended team has the choice of either attempting the two free-throws or of putting the ball in play from out of bounds at the half way line.
- 6. When moving with the ball a player must bounce it continually. This is called dribbling the ball. When a player completes his dribble he must pass or shoot. He must not start a second dribble. It is illegal to dribble with both hands.
- 7. Having completed a dribble a player may only move by pivoting on his rear foot.
- 8. Each team is allowed two time-outs in each half plus one time-out in each period of extra time. A time-out is taken by a team so that it can receive instructions from its coach.
- 9. During the last three minutes of play and during all periods of extra time the attacking team must bring the ball to its front-court within 10 seconds from the moment it has got possession of the ball in the court. Having brought the ball into its front court the same team cannot cause the ball to return to its back-court.
